We looked for traces of the past located at the threshold of visibility: such as war-time hideouts & recent archeological discoveries. We explored the cemetery both as a site of memory and culture as well as the site of nature. The walk also opened up a space for discussing potential ways of commemorating some of the stories and locations that will be visited in reference to examples of commemorative strategies that can be found in the cemetery.
