Description			

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

The 1st evaluation meeting was organized for the consortium partners and invited stakeholders. It was held as a two-part event, consisting of an internal evaluation carried out among project partners (a retrospective meeting) and a public event gathering the project partners and stakeholders.

The objectives of the evaluation meeting were the following:

- presenting and discussing the activities and results of the project so far,
- presenting and discussing the draft of the Difficult Heritage Remembrance
 Framework that is currently being consulted by selected experts,
- presenting and discussing the Reviewed Typology of Difficult Heritage Sites was presented to the stakeholders.
- presenting the project's website (accessible in Polish and English) and discussing the current project's communication and dissemination strategy in order to ensure sustainability of the project results.

The meeting was part of the project's ongoing evaluation process in which the consortium partners gather feedback from various stakeholders representing different project's target groups. It is also part of a project's strategy to keep crucial stakeholders updated about the project's progress in order to build community around it and look for intersections and synergies between activities of various entities active in the field. The feedback was gathered in a form of open discussion as well as in individual conversations among the consortium partners and invited stakeholders. The feedback gathered during the meeting is now being processed by the consortium partners. At least three new synergies with events and/or activities of other entities resulted from the meeting and the consortium partners will seek to explore possibilities of collaboration in these areas.

The event was attended by stakeholders who deal with the topic of difficult heritage in different ways. Representatives of various Jewish organizations (e.g. Jewish Community of Warsaw, the Association of the Jewish Historical Institute in Poland, Foundation for the Documentation of Jewish Cemeteries, Embassy of Israel, Foundation for the Preservation of Jewish Heritage in Poland) were present as well as other experts and activists, including architects, designers, educators, lawyers.

The deliverable was achieved as planned.
