Description	
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>	
The second evaluation meeting of the NeDiPa project took place on February 13, 2024 at the synagogue in Gdańsk. The purpose of the meeting was to wrap up, discuss and evaluate the project and present its results to key organizations, people and initiatives	

working in the field of memory and care for the Jewish heritage in Poland. It consisted of two parts: one during which partner organizations and invited stakeholders discussed the project, the lessons learned and project's achievement (this part was facilitated as an evaluation workshop). The second part was a public-facing event entitled "How to recognize the Jewish cemeteries when you see it?" which was focused on many key issues for the project: the neglected Jewish heritage, respectful ways of caring for it, memory activism and best practices. It began with a film screening entitled "A slant of light" (2021, dir. Wojciech Szumowski). After the movie screening, there was an open discussion with the audience that was an opportunity for the project team to wrap-up the key ideas of the NeDiPa project. It was moderated by Aleksandra Janus and Aleksander Schwarz from the Zapomniane Foundation's team.

The event was attended by stakeholders who deal with difficult heritage in various ways, representatives of various Jewish organizations: Foundation Zbliżenia Kultur, FestivAlt, Foundation Formy Wspólne, Jewish Community in Gdańsk, Palma Foundation, academics from local universities, including dr Monika Arczyńska (Department of Urban Planning and Regional Planning of the Gdańsk University of Technology) with her students as well as dr hab. Monika Zawadzka and dr. arch. Dominika Gołębiewska (Department of Architecture of Cultural Spaces at the Faculty of Architecture of the Gdańsk Academy of Fine Arts) with their students, as well as tour guides, teachers, and educators.

The event resulted in various stakeholders creating a working group, supported by the Gdańsk Municipality, aimed at bringing back the memory of the Jewish cemetery in Gdańsk and commemorating it.
